

After Years Finally Something is Done! But...



It has taken years for our Councillors just to get Leeds Highways to repaint the double-vellow lines near the bus station exit. Why has it taken so long for all those in authority to take this first of many simple measures to resolve the problem of vehicles blocking the bus station exit?

Many vehicles will still not be deterred from parking there.

This was proven just days after the

repainting. The Editor saw the X98 just squeeze past a legally parked car with a blue badge.

Not long after that incident, the inevitable happened - a blockage of 20 minutes on 1 **Nov.** We said it would happen again. Our reader sent us the image and said 'it really is time for double RED lines and a camera.' He sees it happening all the time, as he lives close by.

The word he used to describe

the situation was 'unbelievable'.

We agree. There needs to be more of a visual deterrent ie signs on the street and paint on the road clearly stating it is a bus station exit. No doubt it will be a couple of years before we see those. Meanwhile hundreds more bus passengers will be

Our two Conservative Leeds City Councillors have the time to respond to tweets on other issues but ignore our emails about this matter. Cllr Penny Stables is the only Councillor to contact us about this issue. She tells us: "There are plans to make the double yellow lines on Castle Gate a no stopping area, with cross lines on them. This is waiting for the next TRO (Traffic Regulation Order) for Wetherby to come together and be passed. This will happen but not quickly.'

This issue has yet to be mentioned in the so-called 'Wetherby News' or any other local paper. Only WFP reflects the frustration of residents on this matter.



The 'Community Hub' that Doesn't Want Important Community Information!

The last edition of WFP highlighted the fact that somebody in Kirk Deighton does not want vital community information in the 'Community Hub'. They had removed the bus timetables for the only bus route through the village; a route that will always be under threat because it is so rural. It should be promoted at every opportunity. So the Editor thought he was doing the village a favour by

leaving them in the phone box. He was wrong in that belief.

NOT ALLOWED

In the article we wondered if the person who removed the leaflets was part of *KD Events*, who set up the phone box, or somebody else with a grudge against buses or the Editor. *KD Events* were disappointed that we did not give them more time to respond and wee not pleased with the article. Strangely, their response to our email had no name at the bottom, unlike others sent to us.

For context, we promoted KD Event's calendar

success with a half-page article in the same *WFP* edition on page 11. In their email we received no thanks for that, or for our efforts to encourage bus travel in their village. We also promoted the 'Hub' itself in July's Issue 64 on Page 9 and mentioned leaving the 8 bus timetable in there.



Not a 'Community Hub' in any sense of the word. It is simply a phone box with books in it.

KD Events gave us no clear answer as to whether it was them who removed the leaflets so the Editor asked them again. They replied:

"The Kirk Deighton community hub is a space for all to enjoy, small but perfectly formed. Sadly due to the tiny space we simply don't have room for lots of leaflets. If we allowed one set - we'd have to allow them all. We think it looks great full of books for children and adults. Instead, we invite people to post info leaflets on the big notice board in the centre of village, visible for everyone to see."

So KD Events make no exception for bus timetable leaflets. Bus leaflets are invaluable to many, as not everybody has smartphones and computers. Saving the planet and helping those without cars is clearly not one of Kirk Deighton's priorities. The big notice board cannot be opened by Joe Public so leaving leaflets in it would be pointless.

We find their position quite bizarre but nothing surprises us any more. It is particularly disappointing as KD Events were not going to inform the Editor that he was wasting his time leaving leaflets there. Adding to the weirdness of it all, we have ClIr Alan Lamb who owns the Bay Horse pub where the phone box is situated and has a special interest in buses, as he sits on the Metro / WYCA board in his role as a Leeds City Councillor. Surely he can see the benefit of promoting bus travel in a small village with no shops or doctors or dentist? Especially when at least two timetable cases at bus stops in the village are empty.

It's Kirk Deighton's bus passengers and potential passengers that lose out because of *KD Event's* actions. If Guy Roberts, Chair of *KD Events*, changes his mind, he can contact the Editor or collect the timetable leaflets himself from Wetherby Library.



Bus Shelters in Wetherby

Leeds City Councillor Penny Stables tells us:

"I am working with WYCA, WTC and the LCC Access Officer to try to get more bus shelters in Wetherby. We are initially pitching for shelters on Walton Road by Heuthwaite Avenue, where there is space and many elderly residents, plus Deighton Road near the Care Homes, again where elderly, vulnerable people are left waiting in the rain."

Other Bus Companies Inform Passengers of Cancellations - Not Harrogate Bus Company



The image shows Stagecoach informing their passengers on X / Twitter of a cancellation. Many other bus co's do too. So why won't Harrogate Bus Company, particularly when their service is so unreliable at the moment?

They rely entirely on their Transdev Go app which shows the bus in real time on a map.

The problem is that not all their buses have these trackers so if your bus is not on the map you have to turn up and hope.

This is not good enough from a company that prides itself on customer service. They should use every means possible to inform passengers of major delays and cancellations.

Alec Shelbooke - Shadow Transport Minister

Alec Shelbrooke is our Conservative MP for Wetherby & Easingwold. He was made Shadow Transport Minister in July 2024. None of the 3 main towns in his new constituency has a railway station. Boroughbridge, Wetherby & Easingwold are all reliant on buses. In the July '24 general election he did not mention buses once in campaign literature.

- Transdev's route 7 to Harrogate & Leeds via B Spa was reduced to hourly from half-hourly in Nov '22
- The late night route 7 service from Harrogate at 11.30pm was cut in Nov '22. The last bus is now 10.20pm
- There is NO Saturday service to York (Connexion's route 412) or Otley (Connexion's route 923) since May 22

Only £2 single to Leeds, Harrogate, Otley, Garforth & York

- WYCA/Metro made a big mess of installing new bus stop flags in 2021. Half the stops are still the old type
- WYCA/Metro have stopped printing their 7 invaluable network maps. Not even displayed at W'by Bus Sta

Max Bus Fare rises to £3 from £2






From 1 Jan 2025 the maximum single bus fare will rise to £3. Most in the bus industry expected a reasonable 50p increase to £2.50 but the Labour government thought otherwise.

We asked the only Labour Councillor on Wetherby Town Council, Cllr Alex Riddell, for his view on this and how he thinks this will affect local services. He has not responded.

The only party to contact us about this important issue is the Yorkshire Party.

Co-leader Bob Buxton said: "Why do Londoners get bus fares for £1.75? London has higher



Wetherby Town Council - Continuing to Not Answer Simple Questions



Image we had to put together - New Website Will Not State Political Allegiance. Why? in June 24) and a Facilities Caretaker.

We thank the 15 Wetherby Town Councillors for being unpaid volunteers. Unlike most volunteers they have power and are responsible for spending over £500,000 of our money. Most are Conservative and raised our Council Tax precept by 80% in a cost-of-living crisis in 23/24, much of it to pay for new staff.

They claim to be non-political. This is nonsense shown by the Conservatives spending a great deal of time, money and effort to get their person (Cllr Smith)

In July 2024 Councillors agreed to hide one specific fact about themselves their political allegiance on the website. They are denying information to the public that many would base their vote on. What possible reason have they got for keeping this basic, vital piece of information from us?

All but one of the 9 Council reps on other organisations are Conservative.

Every one of the 12 Council Meeting Chairs are Conservative.

The Mayor & Deputy Mayor are Conservative.

The Town Clerk is Iona Taylor. She is manager to an Assistant Clerk (downgraded from an experienced Deputy Clerk in 2023), an Admin Officer (Dawn Murrell appointed in Oct 24), a Communications & Events Officer (Helena Briden since Nov 2023), a Finance Assistant, a Burials Officer, a Facilities Officer (downgraded from an experienced Facilities Manager, started

There are 8 members of staff, more than most Town Councils. Employment costs are over £150,000 a year. Work is also contracted out.

There are no images of Town Hall staff on their website wetherby.co.uk, unlike Otley Town Council's, and no easy-to-find diagram showing the line management structure. We find it strange that there are no official photos of the Town Clerk that we can find. She has been a senior and influential public figure in this town for many years, yet most residents will not know what she looks like. This does not fit well with being an open and accountable council.

What the Council does: Market * Cemetery * Playgrounds * Distribute £5K Worth of Grants * Building Maintenance * Planning Issues * Events * It spent £562,000 of our money in 23/24. There were many changes in staff in the past year and recruitment is a costly exercise. Two staff who left in 2023 say they would not work for the Council again.

Are we getting high standards and value for money from this Council? We provide evidence in many issues of WFP that suggests we aren't.

Are they open and accountable? Not in our view. Councillors simply ignore the majority of our reasonable and legitimate concerns and questions. See below for example.

The Basic Problem - No one councillor is ultimately responsible for anything. Joint responsibility means no responsibility. If one person is given actions/leadership, things usually get done. When nobody takes overall responsibility, progress is much slower, standards are usually lower or things don't get done at all. Chairs of Committees ignore our questions. Meetings should have clear actions and deadlines. Few do.

Minutes from Wetherby Town Council Meeting in September - Questions Unanswered

After every issue we ask the Town Clerk & the 15 Town Councillors to respond to our legitimate questions about the full Town Council meeting. Every Councillor ignores these emails and refuses to make any comment on serious issues. Following September's meeting we wrote to them: Please read the latest issue of WFP and respond to all the relevant issues raised, and please answer the questions for which you know the answers, or are responsible for. If there are any errors, please tell me. Will anybody raise any of the issues at a Town Council meeting, please? In particular, please would Town Councillors respond:

- to my invitation to meet you on the 2 dates on the front page. Or any other time, if you can't make it.
- and inform me of your actions in relation to any bus issues, particularly station exit blocking and Saturday Services (P4)
- and inform me of your individual and Council view on Wetherspoons. It is unclear from your statement (P6)
- to my question about Cllr Ager-Mills resignation from all cttes. Why is she still a Cllr? (P8)
- and inform me of the exact reasons for stopping using X / Twitter. The reason given was ludicrous (P9)
- to my question why the serious damage to the Church on Corner wall was not mentioned for 6 mths in minutes of Full Council meetings (P9)

to the fact not a single shop, empty or otherwise, has a colourful facade, like on P9.

The above is polite and reasonable so why did all 15 Councillors ignore it? The Editor sends it from his personal email address too, writing as a resident, including "I am a constituent of Wetherby East so would like Cllrs Bradley, Lavocah, Knight, Newcombe & Payne in particular to respond." There is no reason why Councillors cannot make some sort of response, especially when one Councillor admits that she has hardly any direct contact from constituents.



This is ignorant behaviour and totally unacceptable in a public service paid for by us. Not one of them has arranged a meeting to discuss an issue. The Editor will not instigate a meeting because of absurd allegations of

harassment that may be made. As it says above, Councillors hide behind joint responsibility. Their behaviour clearly shows they have no desire to be accountable to a local newsletter and its many readers, or a resident of 30+ years. We will continue to inform residents of this unacceptable behaviour and hope they remember this at election time.

Other questions we asked:

Why were the attendees from Garforth Neighbourhood Planning Forum not named? **NO ANSWER**Who chaired the meeting, mayor or Town Clerk? Why isn't the Chair clearly stated? **NO ANSWER**The meeting lasted less than 1 hour! Why was there so little discussion on matters raised? **NO ANSWER**Why the sudden need for yet another member of staff (market supervisor)? **NO ANSWER**

Cllr Harrington reported that "there have been a number of recent business burglaries". Is it close to 3, 6, 10, 20, 30? **NO ANSWER**

If we're lucky, we may get a response from the Town Clerk to our emails. She decided to respond to just 2 of our questions this time. Her response to the *Twitter / X* issue did not include any more useful information to answer the questions and was therefore pointless. She merely gave a link to information already in the minutes, which we were already fully aware of. This is unhelpful.



Councillors use it but not the Council! Why?

The minutes stated: "Wetherby Town Council's 'X' account is largely inactive, with most members of the public favouring Facebook for day-to-day use and interactions with the council. It was AGREED to deactivate Wetherby Town Council's 'X' account and open a Wetherby Town Council YouTube account to allow for embedded videos."

So we asked "Why did the Council not use X / Twitter?" NO ANSWER. The Council don't use their Twitter / X account so obviously people will use Facebook instead. They then close X / Twitter saying it's not being used. A fait accompli, as they say in France.

We pay for a Communications Officer, a luxury many other Town Councils don't have, so we should expect excellent and comprehensive communications via all major social media platforms. Twitter / X was, and still is, a very popular means of finding out what is going on. It is quick and simple to use. Some people don't use Facebook for many different valid reasons. Many Councillors use their own X / Twitter accounts frequently, yet the Council have decided not to use it. The Council refuse to address any of our arguments and defend their decision.

With so many questions unanswered over the last 3 years, it makes us wonder if this Council has something to hide. There seems to be a culture of 'we can do what we want and not have justify it'. They rewrote their complaints policy, meaning they can now ignore any questions or complaints they deem to be 'vexatious'. They gave no reason why they suddenly decided to change this policy. Was it anything to do with a certain community newsletter? The Council's actions are disturbing in a free society.

Ignoring simple questions is not acceptable. It would take a few minutes to answer most of them. It is especially galling when some Councillors seem to do little. There are Conservatives who have sat on the Council for many years who are not used to being made accountable by local media. Nobody is above criticism. We believe this old-fashioned attitude is why Wetherby has not progressed much at all in the last 20 years, especially compared to towns like Otley. Alec Shelbrooke has been our Conservative MP for over 14 years since May 2010. His basic salary is £91K. In 2019 he won 58% of our vote beating Labour by over 17,000 votes. He was a Remainer.

Alec was a strong supporter of Liz Truss in the Leadership Battle. Prime Minister Truss promoted him to a ministerial MoD post in Sep '22, which he then quit / was sacked after 49 days, the same length of time his boss lasted in post.

Early 2024 Alec was awarded the one of the highest knighthood honours by Liz Truss. The Knight Commander of the Order of the British Empire (KBE) entitles him to be addressed as "Sir". He did not mention his honour on his social media but changed official images to say 'Sir Alec ...'

We do not call him "Sir" as he has shown no respect to us.

In 2024 he won 39% of the vote in our new constituency of Wetherby & Easingwold by just under 5,000 votes. He is now one of 121 Conservative MPs (compared to 402 Labour MPs).
