Council Apologises Over Data Breach

The Town Clerk of Wetherby Town Council, Iona Taylor, has said sorry for identifying people and email addresses in a recent email they sent.

The Editor informed them of the breach of GDPR rules and the Town Clerk



informed those affected and those on social media of her regret and explained her actions to stop it happening again.

The Council had to apologise in July for a separate incident (Issue 66).

On this occasion the Council has acted quickly and responsibly. But it is concerning that no Councillor or the Town Clerk noticed the error themselves. We have written before on their apparent lack of checking procedures (eg missing bus station off town map)

In their post on social media, the Council mentioned 5 people being identified, but not the fact there were 13 email addresses on their list. cont'd overleaf

Free Press Boosts Chances of 'Spoons Progressing

Thanks to the Editor's posts on social media, the chances of Wetherspoons obtaining planning permission have increased. Many people want this pub chain in the town as soon as possible, and are constantly asking on social media for the latest news. The Editor looked on the Leeds City Council planning portal and was surprised to find that only 6 people had supported the application. He posted this fact on various social media platforms to motivate supporters to make their voice heard. He put a link in the post and told them it was a simple quick procedure to register and tick the 'support' box before the deadline of 17 Oct. Within hours many had done exactly that.

Final Figures: 155 Support (6 before Editor's post) 2 Against (1 before Editor's post)

On many issues in this town there is much apathy and lack of practical action eq bus blocking, but not on this one. Only a tiny minority don't realise that a Spoons would be great for this town, and attract 1000s of visitors (off the A1(M)). It would benefit the quality pubs in the town if Wetherby becomes a popular night-time destination again. 

Bus Timetables in Pub Hub Removed

The Editor left some bus timetables in the Kirk Deighton community hub phone box. They were the no. 8 bus that runs through the village to Wetherby & Knaresborough / Harrogate. A couple of weeks later they had gone. He was a little suspicious so he left some more and checked a couple of days later. They weren't there.

The 8 is the only bus service in the village. What sort of a person would remove such valuable community information?

Maybe this person has a grievance against buses or the Editor, who knows



We wrote to KD Events who look after the Hub and asked if the bus timetables were welcome (maybe they don't want to promote their only bus service!). We have not yet had a reply.



Cllr Alan Lamb runs the pub where the phone box is situated. He is involved in improving bus services so perhaps he can sort this out. Or a village councillor.

But at the moment it looks like one person or perhaps more in the community don't want valuable community information in the community hub! It's disappointing and the opposite to the attitude we have found in the village of East Keswick regarding buses.

We feel sorry for Kirk Deighton passengers and potential passengers. The 8 is a rural route and will always be under constant threat of being withdrawn, if not used.

Alec Shelbooke - Shadow Transport Minister

Alec Shelbrooke is our Conservative MP for Wetherby & Easingwold. He was made Shadow Transport Minister in July 2024. None of the 3 main towns in his new constituency has a railway station. Boroughbridge, Wetherby & Easingwold are all reliant on buses. In the July '24 general election he did not mention buses once in campaign literature.

Since his appointment these are his tweets or posts about buses.

1 Tweet / Facebook Post 8 July - 17 Oct:

On 30 August he asked the Transport Minister "What assessment has she made of the potential impact of parked cars outside bus stations on levels of delays on regional bus networks?"

We have informed Alec about the many bus issues we face in Wetherby and area, including

- Parked vehicles blocking Wetherby Bus Station Exit
- Cut of 7 rte from half-hourly to hour exactly 2 years ago
- Lack of Saturday & evening services to York

He has yet to respond to us about any bus issue.

3 Months in Post and Only One Tweet or Post about Buses!

It is clear to us and surely most right-thinking people that Alec has very little interest in buses. But if you think differently, please send us the evidence and we'll publish it. His question to the Transport Minister was pointless and we ask him how the answer would improve bus services in his constituency (it wouldn't). Even the question was not phrased properly - he should have used the



word 'vehicles' not 'cars'. Lorries and vans also cause blockages.

Tad to Whitby for £2 but



.... it takes 3 hours. Less if you catch the bus in York. The bus is the 840 Coastliner There are no evening buses back to Wetherby from either place.

The route over the North York Moors was featured on the One Show with some fabulous drone shots. The reporter mentioned that it was voted the 'Most Scenic Bus Route in Britain' in 2018. The Editor carried out this national survey attracting over 15,000 votes from all over the country. It was on the national news when the result was announced six years ago and the Editor was interviewed. The route has featured on programs like 'This Morning' too. Nobody has done a similar survey since.

The £2 single fare continues for the rest of the year but it is unclear what will happen in 2025. It would be good to know what Alec Shelbrooke's view on this is. Would the Conservatives like to see it scrapped?

Reminder of Bus Facts for our Councillors & MP, Alec Shelbrooke (Shadow Transport Minister)

- Transdev's route 7 to Harrogate & Leeds via B Spa was reduced to hourly from half-hourly in Nov '22
- The late night route 7 service from Harrogate at 11.30pm was cut in Nov '22. The last bus is now 10.20pm
- There is NO Saturday service to York (Connexion's route 412) or Otley (Connexion's route 923) since May 22
- WYCA/Metro made a big mess of installing new bus stop flags in 2021. Half the stops are still the old type
- WYCA/Metro have stopped printing their 7 invaluable network maps. Not displayed at W'by Bus Sta either

Bus Blocking - No Cllr Support for Simple Temporary Measure

Wetherby Town Council has no committee that covers the vital public service bringing people into town to spend money in our shops and businesses - buses. That means the Council can ignore problems like this one if they want. Compare that to the very large interest they take in the car park charging issue. They put all their efforts into helping car owners avoid paying for parking. Car park charges exist in most UK towns and cities, and helps to encourage use of public transport. Revenue raised can be used to improve the buses too.

But since June 2024 it now has an agenda item "Highways and Transport" in their Full Council meeting. After so many years they decided that buses may be worth discussing. It was just "Highways" before that time. Perhaps your community newsletter had something to do with that?

However, a change of name has not resulted in any interest in the bus issues that we raise. Nothing in the last 4 months about bus blocking despite it happening regularly and highlighted in these pages. A couple of councillors have the cheek to say they are interested in buses but there



is no evidence to back that up. They clearly do not care (evidence please if you disagree). We wonder if the reason they ignore this major issue is because the Editor raises it. Surely they could not

be that immature. In the last issue we informed Councillors

that we





would put a large "No Parking" notice up in the empty property shown in the image, if they supported this better-than-nothing temporary measure. No response from any of them.

After such a long time, we have become stoical and laugh at the absurdity of the situation.

But we wait until it happens again and many hundreds of bus users are inconvenienced yet again.

Why Still No Saturday Buses to York & Otley?

There is no logic as to why the residents of Wetherby are denied a trip to York and Otley on Saturdays. And likewise Otley and York folk are denied a day out in our town, enjoying the river and spending money in our shops. We cannot take advantage of the £2 single fare on the weekend to visit a major city on our doorstep. Or the popular town of Otley with its market, 'Spoons & Chevin.

It's now 2.5 years since these services were cut. Both routes are tendered services ie subsidised by the taxpayer and both are run by Connexions Buses on weekdays. We asked company boss Craig Temple the reason for the situation and if there is any hope of getting the Saturday service back in the near future. He replied "It is up to the relevant councils to pay for these - we are tied by them. There has been talk recently about there being a tender coming out for the 412, but I've not seen anything".

Wetherby Town Council have never raised this as an issue at their full council meetings. Do they care? There is no evidence that they do.

We asked our 3 Leeds City Councillors Harrington, Lamb & Stables what they are doing to get these services back eg sending emails to Metro / WYCA / Mayor or raising it at meetings with them. No response.



Guide to Social Media - Advice



The benefits are obvious - you can exchange information and views with other people. And it's free. The downside is that people abuse it and can spread misinformation and unpleasant views.

Difference between X / Twitter & Facebook

It is surprising that some people think that these two platforms are the same. They are clearly not.



X / Twitter Intelligent discussion on serious issues is very rare indeed on this platform. Too many people have opposite views and won't budge. The limited number of characters means there is no depth to any discussion. Mature exchanges are rare and often spoilt by offensive language, aggressive tone and extreme views.

Use it to put forward your point of view if you like but you can expect the dregs of society to respond; don't expect too much. The trouble with X / Twitter is that you can quickly and easily set up an account, and not have to prove you are who

you say you are. Or have any picture of yourself. In other words, you can be anonymous. That means the keyboard cowards (they are not warriors) can write what they want with no consequence, unless you have time and money to sue for libel, assuming you can somehow identify them. It is pointless reporting any offensive poster to X / Twitter; they spoilers will simply set up another account. Just block them and try to ignore them. It is far too easy to be anti-social on this social media platform. It is best used only to find certain information and see the views of your fav celebs.

tacebook

Facebook You are more likely to get a civilised exchange on Facebook because you should be identifiable. The clue is in the name FACEbook. You should have a face because when people know who you are, you are far less likely to insult somebody. Yet Facebook allows anonymous accounts. This means cowards can hide behind fake profiles to

harass and insult, as we know only too well at the Free Press.

Group Administrators have a lot of power and can ban decent people for no good reason. There is no proper procedure of justice if you are unhappy with the Admin. They can easily be swayed by a complaining group of people who can use their positions in the community to deny freedom of speech. Admin don't have to explain their reasoning or logic. There is no democracy; Admin are judge and jury. Many of the larger groups have got far too big (posts are drowned out by the sheer number of them) and they don't have the time to police all the fake profiles. Of course, there are some excellent Facebook groups, like Boston Spa Grumbler & East Keswick Parish Council which are run properly. Their Admin do a fantastic job for the community and we thank them for their hard work.

nextdoor

No community forum is perfect but we would recommend Nextdoor at www.nextdoor.co.uk . It is monitored by moderators and complaints about posts and posters are voted upon by many different people. There are fewer adverts from people and it just seems more civilised.

How To Deal with Personal Insults - An Example of a Faceless Profile

A 'John Scott' recently responded to a post with the image below, which made a simple suggestion to brighten our town up.



'John' calls me a 'complete fool' in the first post and 'complete tool' in the second. Childish stuff and perhaps the person is a child. We could not verify John's identity so have no idea if he is 'John Scott'. There were no images or any information about his family /

profile. Nothing either in his infrequent posts to offer a clue as to who he was. He was faceless on Facebook.

So I asked 'John' to verify his identity and meet me in person. I wanted to meet him in person for a civilised discussion on his views but no response. Both posts disappeared ie he or Admin deleted them.

Perhaps 'John' will respond now and hopefully offer an apology.

Kirby moaning because I described him as a complete fool. It was a typo error, I meant complete tool. I mean come on, who would advise people to illegally graffiti Telecoms boxes with pictures of psilocybin magic mushrooms like the one in the picture he posted, along with spray painting walls etc. He must be short of content to keep on wittering about me. I think I need to block his profile.

Personal abuse is not acceptable on a community Facebook forum, just as it would not be acceptable on the streets.

Sadly, there are much worse social media group members than 'John Scott'. There are some very unpleasant characters out there who express extreme views with extreme language. It's often an outlet for their anger and is often nothing to do with you so don't take it personally. They seem to be full of hate and we must pity them. They always generalise and give no details to justify their abusive messages so an exchange is pointless.

Whatever you do, Do Not Respond. Their only desire is to get a reaction from you. Rise above it. Do not descend to their level. It's a natural instinct to defend yourself but try not to in this particular way. It's difficult but remember that normal intelligent people reading their offensive posts will realise that such extreme views are not coming from a reasonable person. Saying nothing is not a sign of weakness but strength.

Instead you should keep screenshots of all extreme personal insults and inform your antagonist, if possible by messenger or a similar private method, that you are greatly upset by their behaviour and that it must stop. A warning about possible legal action if it continues is advised.

Don't respond to negativity with more negativity. Just put your head down and prove your critics wrong.





To engage the community in September, we held a bat walk around Boston Spa which was attended by about 30 people of all

Bats are the world's only flying mammal and are threatened by a range of issues such as habitat loss, habitat fragmentation and the reduction in their food supply (insects). All species of bats are protected by law in the UK.

We started with an introduction into the species group and explained that bats navigate using echolocation. This is where they will make a series of clicking sounds and listen to the returning echoes. To hear their vocalisations, a piece of equipment known as a bat detector must be used to convert the calls into a frequency humans can hear.

Council thinks Spoons will have 'risk of congestion on High St'

It is unknown whether the all-Conservative Planning Committee of Wetherby Town Council gave their overall support to the planning application of a Wetherspoons in the former Angel pub. Cllr Connor Mulhall is chair of the Planning Committee and they submitted this on 14 Oct to Leeds City Council:

"While Wetherby Town Council has no objections to the interior designs proposed, it does raise concerns as to the significant risk of congestion caused on High Street due to the proposed design for waste management and deliveries. The council requests that the following be considered as part of the drawing up of resulting conditions: Regulation of operating hours for deliveries and waste collection to outside of peak hours as to ensure the amenity of neighbouring residents and vehicles is not compromised. Regulation of the programme of deliveries so as to minimise detrimental impact of the proposed drop off zone on traffic along High Street. Requesting the provision of accessible toilet facilities through the implementation of Changing Places toilets where possible"

We wonder what their evidence is to justify a 'significant' risk of congestion. Are they for a Spoons overall or not? Most Councillors have kept pretty quiet about their views. Cllr Lamb has clearly stated that he would welcome a Wetherspoons.

We need this extremely popular pub chain asap to attract people to the town. The decline of the Thursday market and the long-term empty shops and businesses are there for all to see. The town does very little to attract people to the town and is poor at marketing its best asset, the river (no sign yet to Salmon Leap bench or any info displays of ducks, fish or other wildlife like Otley)

Can You Help at East Keswick's Climate Change Garden?


The official launch of East Keswick Village Hall's Climate Change Garden has taken place and was a great success

Exciting plans ahead... East Keswick Climate Change Garden (EKCCG)

The Illingworth Field public consultation results gathered during 2023/24 helped inform the design and development plan of East Keswick Climate Change Garden. A summary of public consultation results is available on East Keswick Village Hall website: Public Consultation - Illingworth Field.

As a rural village, we are very proud and fortunate to have our own Wildlife Trust. East Keswick Wildlife Trust have been working with and guiding the Village Hall Trustees since the inception of this project. The primary aim on the development of this field will be the retention of community green space, incorporating a focus on the challenges of climate change for the local environment and the Village Hall's sustainability.

Our key objectives are to:

- Enhance biodiversity by creating new habitats, thereby improving and connecting existing local multi-functional green corridors. This offers the potential for wider links around the parish and beyond, including Ellikers Nature Reserve to the north of our East Keswick Climate Change Garden.
- Provide outdoor learning space for the local and wider community to reinforce how careful environmental husbandry contributes positively to climate change.
- Work towards the Village Hall achieving carbon neutral status by 2030 from its current annual emission rate of 2,644 kg CO2 by introducing creative green solutions.
- Foster an inter-generational approach that creates a positive environmental legacy for future generations
- Broaden the range of inclusive, safe and healthy outdoor activities and events.

Wetherby Town Council - Who is on it & What they do



Image we had to put together - New Website Will Not State Political Allegiance. Why?

We thank the 15 Wetherby Town Councillors for being unpaid volunteers. Unlike most volunteers they have power and are responsible for spending over half a million pounds of our money. Most are Conservative and raised our Council Tax precept by 80% in a cost-of-living crisis in 23/24, much of it to pay for new staff.

They claim to be non-political. This is nonsense shown by the Conservatives spending a great deal of time, money and effort to get their person elected in Feb 24.

In July 2024 Councillors agreed to hide a basic fact about themselves - their political allegiance on the website. They are denying information to the public that many would base their vote on. What possible reason have they got for this decision? It proves they do not wish to be open or accountable, if they want to hide such a basic piece of information.

All but one of the 9 Council reps on other organisations are Conservative. We note every one of the 12 Council Meeting Chairs are Conservative.

The Mayor & Deputy Mayor are Conservative.

The Town Clerk is Iona Taylor. She is manager to an Assistant Clerk (downgraded from an experienced Deputy Clerk in 2023), an Admin Officer (Dawn Murrell appointed in Oct 24), a Communications & Events Officer (Helena Briden since Nov 2023), a Finance Assistant, a Burials Officer, a

Facilities Officer (downgraded from an experienced Facilities Manager, started in June 24) and a Facilities Caretaker.

There are 8 members of staff, more than most Town Councils. Employment costs are over £150,000 a year. Work is also contracted out.

There are no images of Town Hall staff on their website wetherby.co.uk, unlike Otley Town Council's, and no easy-to-find diagram showing the line management structure. We find it strange that there are no official photos of the Town Clerk that we can find. She has been a senior and influential public figure in this town for many years, yet most residents will not know what she looks like. This does not fit well with being an open and accountable council.

What the Council does: Market * Cemetery * Playgrounds * Distribute £5K Worth of Grants * Building Maintenance * Planning Issues * Events * It spent £562,000 of our money in 23/24. There were many changes in staff in the past year and recruitment is a costly exercise. Two staff who left in 2023 say they would not work for the Council again.

Are we getting high standards and value from money from this Council? We provide evidence in many issues of WFP that suggests we aren't.

Are they open and accountable? Not in our view. Councillors simply ignore the majority of our reasonable and legitimate concerns and questions.

The Basic Problem - No one councillor is ultimately responsible for anything. Joint responsibility means no responsibility. If one person is given actions/leadership, things usually get done. When nobody takes overall responsibility, progress is much slower, standards are usually lower or things don't get done at all. Meetings should have clear actions and deadlines. Few do.

Where everyone is responsible, no one is really responsible.

Minutes from Wetherby Town Council Meeting in September - Lasted less than an hour

Summary: ** Short Meeting ** Only 2 Big Events per Year ** Consider Even More Staff!

** Cllr Ager-Mills Quits All Cttes But Doesn't Resign from Council **

11 out of 15 Councillors attended. Cllrs Buckle, Chapman and Newcombe sent apologies. No residents were present. Leeds City Cllrs Alan Lamb & Penny Stables attended. Also present were 2 members of the Garforth Neighbourhood Planning Forum. Why were these people not named? This is not an open and accountable council when they will not even name people from public organisations who attend meetings.

It was not stated who chaired this meeting. Was it the Mayor or the Town Clerk? Why isn't the Chair clearly stated?

The meeting lasted less than one hour! Why was there so little discussion on matters or new issues raised?

Report from Leeds City Clirs: Road Safety Improvements. "The 20mph traffic regulation order for Linton Road has now been completed and over the next weeks/months activity will be seen as the schemes are delivered."

Mystery People from Garforth

Council Strategy: Only 2 Big Events to be Held per year, one being the bonfire and fireworks. That does not sound very ambitious to us. But perhaps just as well as they have put on events costing many £1000s which have benefited only a tiny minority of Wetherby residents eg the King's Coronation big TV screen event.

"Consideration of appointment of a market supervisor deferred". Amazing how other similar councils can do without all these extra posts. Why the sudden need for yet another member of staff? More staff can mean manager's salaries are increased.

Cllr Ager-Mills has resigned from the both the Planning & Appeals Committees, her fifth and final resignations this year. She does not sit on any Council committees now so why has she not resigned from the Council? No reasons given for any of her resignations.

Crime Stats: Pointless us telling you them, as prisons included and no comparisons made with previous months or years. No comments on them from any councillor.

Police Meeting: Cllr Harrington reports that "there have been a number of recent business burglaries". That's it, no other information, no figures, no details, no comment from her. A "number"! Is it close to 3, 6, 10, 20, 30? Poor.

Payments: Grass-cutting in cemetery alone cost £2000 for one month (July / Aug). Seems a lot for what, one or two cuts?

Summary: ** Council Stops Using Twitter / X ** Over £250K spent on staff ** Damaged Wall Ignored **

Social Media: "Wetherby Town Council's 'X' account is largely inactive, with most members of the public favouring Facebook for day-to-day use and interactions with the council. It was AGREED to deactivate Wetherby Town Council's 'X' account and open a Wetherby Town Council Youtube account to allow for embedded videos."





Can readers see what's happened here? It is a self-fulfilling prophesy. The Council don't use their Twitter / X account so OBVIOUSLY people will use Facebook instead. They then close X / Twitter saying it's not being used. Hard to believe.

Obvious questions that need to be answered:

- 1 Why did the Council not use X/Twitter? It was and still is a very popular means of finding out what is going on. It is quick and simple to use. Many Councillors use their own X/Twitter frequently, yet the Council have decided not to use it. Doesn't make sense.
- 2 Why don't they use Twitter / X as well as Facebook, giving people a choice? Some people don't use Facebook for many different valid reasons.

The Council have a Communications Officer, unlike many other Town Councils, so we should expect excellent and comprehensive communications via all major social media platforms.

Wetherby Business Association - Cllr Ager-Mills represents this organisation, not its Chair Jamie Hullah. She reported "on the success of a local loyalty scheme".

No figures or research were provided to back up this claim. We heard it was \underline{not} a success. Of course, it depends on your definition of success.

Staff: Personnel expenditure for this year to date is over £250,000 to date. This seems a staggering amount to us.

An Occupational Health Assessment for a staff member will cost nearly £600.

Property Ctte: A representative of Wetherby Civic Society requested that the committee consider setting aside a small amount of funding to make Wetherby's Georgian Bath House safer for visitors. It was suggested that the railing fixtures on steps into the bath house and fencing around the pool should be prioritised due to the risk of falling posed to visitors.

Damaged Cemetery Wall, right: Why has this wall at the entrance to the cemetery not been mentioned at all yet in any minutes we have seen? A car hit it over 6 months ago. This is very strange.

MP Alec Shelbrooke's 2nd Choice for Leader fails too

Alec Shelbrooke has been our Conservative MP for over 14 years since May 2010.

In 2019 he won 58% of our vote beating Labour by over 17,000 votes. He was a Remainer.

In 2024 he won 39% of the vote in our new constituency of Wetherby & Easingwold by just under 5,000 votes From Dec '19 to 21 June 2023 he has voted 640 times out of 817 (78%) In that time he has rebelled twice

With 2 weeks to go, he is keeping schtum.

Alec's basic salary is £91,000. He also receives expenses for accommodation, travel, office costs.

The website theyworkforyou.com informs us that Alec's extra income so far in 2024 is:

Jan: £1050 for 4 appearances* on Talk TV (4 hours work)

Feb: £225 for completing Ipsos MORI survey (1hr 15mins)

Mar: £300 for 1 appearance on Talk TV (1 hour)

Apr: £1400 for 7 appearances on Talk TV (4 hours 30 mins)

Aug: £1000 for 4 appearances on Talk TV (3 hours)

Aug: £4999 - Support linked to an MP but received by a local party organisation or indirectly via a central party organisation from Oakdale Farms Ltd of Northallerton to the Alec Shelbrooke Campaign Fund.

Sept: £50 for 1 appearance on Talk TV (25 mins)

*appearances can also mean non-appearance when his participation is not needed ie he is paid a cancellation fee.

The total is £4025 for about 14 hours work (about £287 per hour). This figure excludes the August £5K donation.

Talk TV ended its TV channel in May 2024 and is now only available online.

The only thing we would like to know is why Alec only appears on a minority channel that many of his constituents will not have heard of. There are other commercial channels who would surely pay for his views, like GB News or Sky News. Is it because Alec gets a more sympathetic hearing on Talk TV, which is owned by Rupert Murdoch?

We need to see Alec on political shows and the news, both locally and nationally and on terrestrial TV. It is difficult (and always has been) to find out what he thinks on so many national and local issues. The lack of any real **local** journalism these days means he can hide away with nobody (except people like us) to try to make him accountable.


